


# Evangelism and Missions: Today and Tomorrow Various Christian Perspectives

## Keynote Speaker: Professor Emeritus Steve Bevans (SVD)

**Steve Bevans** is a priest in the missionary congregation of the Society of the Divine Word and Louis J Luzbetak, SVD Professor of Mission and Culture, Emeritus.

He is the (co-)author and (co-)editor of many books including *Models of Contextual Theology* (2002), *Constants in Context: A Theology of Mission for Today* (2004), *An Introduction to Theology in Global Perspective* (2009), *Prophetic Dialogue: Reflections on Christian Mission Today* (2011), *A Century of Catholic Mission* (2013), and *Mission on the Road to Emmaus: Constants, Context, and Prophetic Dialogue* (2015).

He is a member of the World Council of Churches' Commission on World Mission and Evangelism.

## Program Outline

Professor Emeritus Steve Bevans will present a Roman Catholic perspective on three recent mission documents in dialogue with each other:

- The Lausanne Movement's *The Cape Town Commitment* (2010)
- The WCC's *Together Towards Life* (2013)
- Pope Francis' *Evangelii Gaudium* (2013)

Three respondents will then deepen the dialogue through ecumenical perspectives:

- **Rev Dr Darrell Jackson**, Senior Lecturer in Missiology, Morling College (Baptist)
- **Rev Dr Andrew Williams**, General Secretary of the Uniting Church Synod of New South Wales and the ACT (Uniting)
- **Rev Kevin Hovey**, Head of Department, Pastoral and Cross Cultural Ministry, Alpha Crucis College (Pentecostal)

After lunch, Professor Bevans will make a second presentation on ways of moving forwards in mission, followed by Q & A .
