

Online safety for culturally and linguistically diverse families

In 2022 eSafety commissioned Orima Research to conduct a literature review to obtain further insights into how to best support CALD families to stay safe online.

The literature review focused on:

- Digital literacy and online behaviours
- Knowledge, attitudes and perceptions towards online child sexual abuse and online safety
- Engagement with government/community campaigns and programs

Key barriers to protecting children and young people from online harm

The literature review found that CALD parents and carers are concerned about their children's online safety. Across a number of sources, the review identified three key barriers that are likely to be faced by CALD families in relation to preventing online child sexual abuse:

- limited English proficiency;
- limited digital literacy; and
- sensitivity of the topic.

In particular, the sensitive nature of online child sexual abuse is likely to pose a barrier when engaging with parents and carers and encouraging them to talk openly about it with their children.



Effective communication strategies with CALD communities

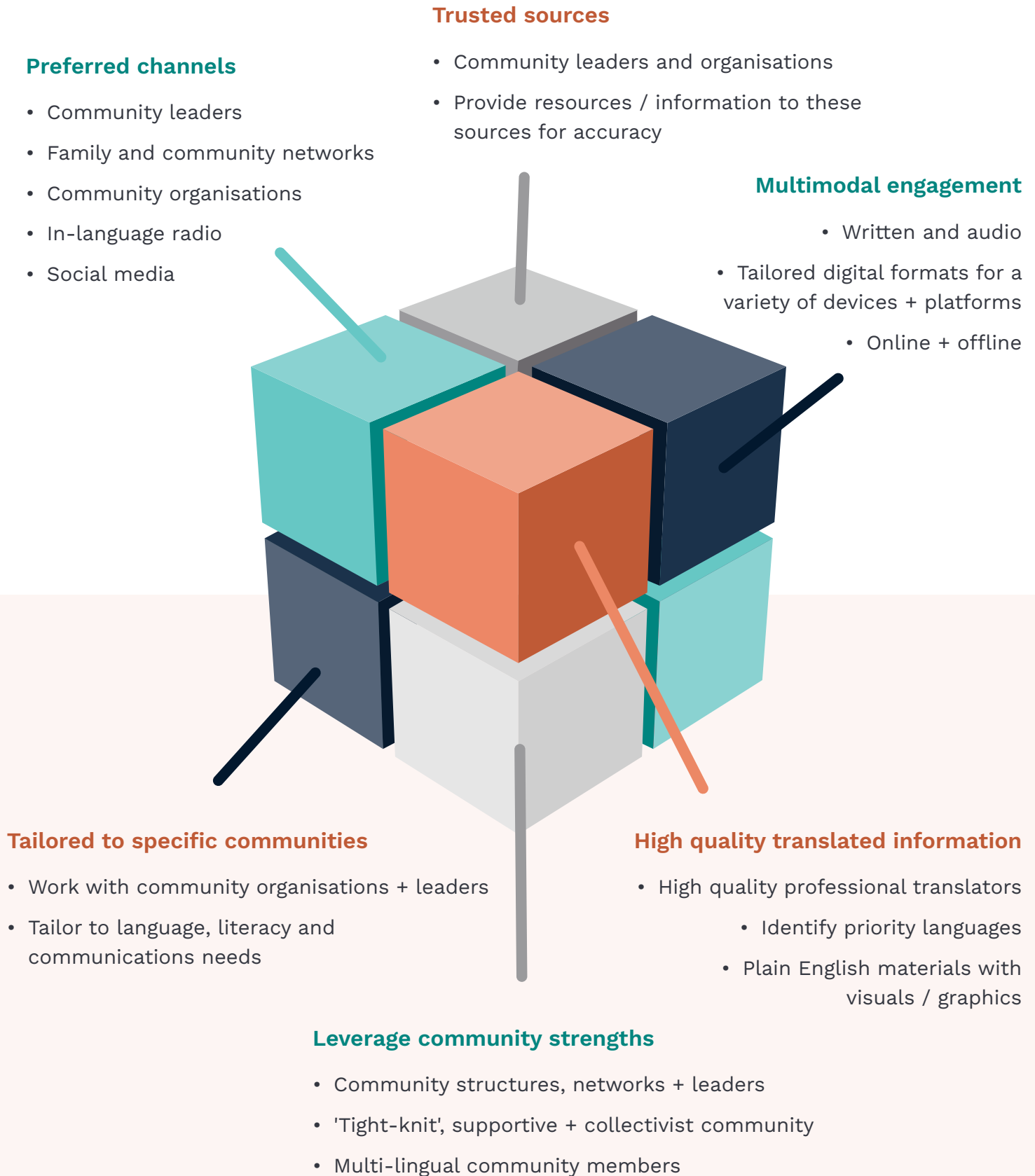
