A global-scale Multi-faith/Multi-sector Alliance for Climate Action will be launched at COP27 in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt. The Alliance is a bridge between existing multi-faith actors and their coalitions, and key secular actors (including governments, multilateral organizations, private sector, civil society organizations and media) to explore and advance collaboration on specific areas for climate action. It is a collaboration of the willing, sharing common goals and diverse experiences and networks, working together to elevate and add value to existing initiatives.

The Alliance will focus on action areas to amplify ongoing both secular and faith originated initiatives through engagement of both faith and secular networks:

- Systematically engage faith-related media on climate issues —research, contact, develop and
 distribute content, while also enabling faiths to make their key stories and perspectives
 accessible to and sharable by the secular media
- Frame and publicize **values parameters of investment funds** to leverage public capital with the support and engagement of investments and other assets of religious institutions and networks towards the support for and development of a specific Multi-Faith Just Transition Fund
- Develop support towards a **Global Energy Access Initiative** by engaging faith networks as key partners with secular organisations to further investment and infrastructure building to enable global energy access through, including through faith sensitive communications campaigns
- Support **mobilization of women and youth leaders** for achievement of carbon emissions goals through engagement of women faith leaders and their networks
