Read Galatians 5 vv.22-25

A bowl of mixed fruits may be placed in the centre of the worship space.

Imagine each of the 'fruits' of the Spirit as real fruit...

Which of the fruits do you find least attractive?... Why?...

Think of a situation of conflict in your community between people of different culture of background...

- which of the fruits would be most nourishing in this situation?....
- how may it be grown?...
- what single practical action can you take in the next week to nurture that particular fruit?...
