# Understanding the wounded heart of a parish

- Shock, disbelief, sadness, loss, anger, hurt, frustration, anxiety, devastation
- ► The unique place of the church in the lives of parishioners
- ▶ Betrayal and the breach of sacred trust
- ▶ Conflict following disputed outcomes

# Key variables which impact the pastoral care needed by a parish

- ▶ Nature of the misconduct (5 levels)
- Number and vulnerability of the victims
- Time and place of the offence
- Seniority / staff position of the offender
- Personal context of the offender

### Theological Foundations of Pastoral Care for a Parish in Crisis

- ►Truth telling
- ▶ Justice seeking
- ► Grace giving
- ▶ Peace (shalom) making



### Seven things survivors tell us they need from the church

- ▶ Being believed and affirmed as doing the 'right thing'
- Advocacy and support through any investigative and judicial process
- Hearing the clear judgement of the church that 'what happened to you was wrong, you are not at fault'

## Seven things survivors tell us they need from the church

- ▶ An apology from the leadership of the church
- ▶ Compensation Care and Assistance
- ► A faith journey of hope and healing
- Seeing preventative and responsive measures for safety implemented

### 4 things parishes tell us they need to heal

- Appropriate, timely and clear communication about process and outcomes which honours their trust placed in church leadership
- Opportunities to reflect on and share their own responses and concerns
- Ways to acknowledge the pain and seek healing within the processes of the faith community
- ► Change in the systems which failed
