Venue: Rosebank College, Five Dock, corner of Queens Road and Harris Road. There is some onsite parking (Enter on Harris road) and street parking on weekends.



Time: The Workshop is 1:30 – 3 pm, followed by afternoon tea. The AGM starts at 3:30.

The workshop provides an opportunity to consider what sacred places mean in our own story. Charlie will then take us on a journey and visually demonstrate the spiritual connection to land for Aboriginal People through time and share how Aboriginal people experience the land as sacred. We



conclude recognising that a sense of the sacred is available for all and we may we come away with a deeper appreciation for the earth we walk on, the ancient and sacred stories of Aboriginal people, and our own sense of place and belonging to the land.

Charlie Trindall is a Gamilaroi man from north western NSW. Charlie has extensive experience facilitating groups and communities and works in the Healing and Reparations Directorate in the NSW Department of Aboriginal Affairs with the Healing Foundation coordinating forums between Government, NGO's and Aboriginal communities.
