

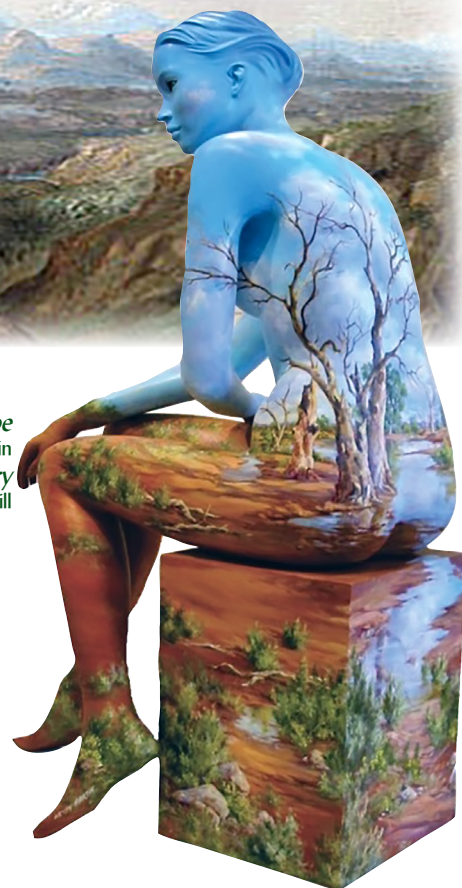


Presenter:
