Keynote speaker Dr John Harrison, will canvass contemporary issues in the media:

- * The phenomenon of 'fake news' (of the Pope's World Communications day statement)
- * The demise of the six o'clock TV news as Telcos become broadcasters
- * The backlash against social media platforms
- * The threat to journalists and journalism through surveillance and data retention.
- * Given this context, what is the role and function of the religious press?

Two key trends:

- People will pay for quality journalism (*e.g. The New York Times* has moved from a revenue model to a subscription model.

- Long form investigative journalism is more sought after than click bait.

- **What do both "hope" and "trust" mean in the contemporary context?**

Dr Harrison teaches media law and ethics at The University of Queensland. His current research involves long form digital storytelling of the natural, cultural and social history of the western coast of Cape York, major site of contestation between Indigenous peoples and extractive industry. He is a regular media commentator on ABC local Radio, and the author of several books and articles n journalism and media practice. He was the founding editor of the Uniting Church publication *Journey* into the 1980's
